Dr. Padela is a Professor of Emergency Medicine, Bioethics and the Medical Humanities at the Medical College of Wisconsin, Milwaukee, and the director of a non-profit “think and do” organization, The Initiative on Islam and Medicine, Glendale Heights, IL. He holds an MD from Weill Cornell Medical College and an MSc in Healthcare Research from the University of Michigan. He completed emergency medicine training at the University of Rochester and a clinical ethics fellowship at the University of Chicago, as well as visiting fellowships at the Oxford Centre for Islamic Studies in the UK and the International Institute for Islamic Thought in Herndon, Virginia. He has authored over 170 peer-reviewed articles and book chapters and one monograph, *Maqasid al-Shari’ah and Biomedicine: Bridging Moral, Ethical and Policy Discourses* (IIIT Press 2024). He is also editor/co-editor of five books: *Medicine and Shari’ah: A Dialogue in Islamic Bioethics* (University of Notre Dame Press 2021), *Islam and Biomedicine* (Springer 2022), *Organ Donation in Islam: The Interplay of Jurisprudence, Ethics, and Society* (Lexington Books 2022), *Islam, Muslims, and COVID-19: The Intersection of Ethics, Health, and Social Life in the Diaspora* (Brill 2024), and *Bridging Bioscience and Islam: Engaging Big Questions about the Human Being* (Palgrave Macmillan, 2026).

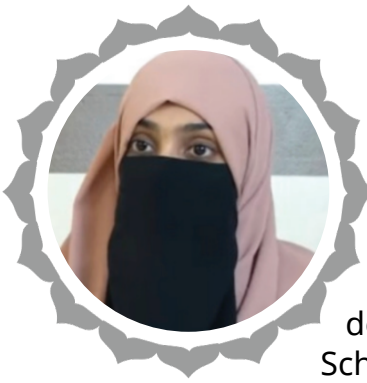
Bilal Ali Ansari

Shaykh Bilal Ali Ansari graduated with a bachelor's degree in Applied Behavioral Sciences with a focus on adult learning theory from National Louis University, Lisle, Illinois. He studied Arabic and Islamic Studies at the Jāmi'a al-Ḥasanain in Faisalabad, Pakistan, where he mastered classical and modern texts in Arabic, Islamic Theology, Islamic Law, Qur'anic Studies, and Ḥadīth. Shaykh Bilal holds certifications in ḥadīth from various reputable Islamic scholars and continued his studies in discursive theology (kalām), Islamic Jurisprudence (usūl al-fiqh), and Islamic Philosophy at Darul Qasim College, where he serves as the Head of the Department of Ḥadīth Studies. His research interests include early Ḥadīth methodology and nomenclature, Ḥanafī legal theory, education and curriculum development, mental health, and Islamic bioethics. BEng of Chemical Engineering from the University of Bath, in the UK, Dr. Malik became one of the first Muslim students to embark on an MSc in Philosophy, Science, and Religion at the University of Edinburgh. With two PhDs in Chemical Engineering and Theology from the University of Nottingham and St Mary's University, respectively, Dr. Malik is further enriching his Islamic studies under the guidance of Shaykh Ali Laraki, among other scholars. In addition to being a Senior Fellow of Advance HE and Fellow of the International Society for Science and Religion (ISSR), he is the Chief Editor for Palgrave Macmillan's monograph series and encyclopedia on Islam and Science.



Mohd Yusof Mohamad (PhD)

Dr. Mohd Yusof Mohamad is an Assistant Professor at the Kulliyah of Allied Health Sciences, International Islamic University Malaysia (IIUM). He received his undergraduate and postgraduate education in the fields of Biomedical Sciences, Human Anatomy, and Tissue Engineering from IIUM. In 2019, he became the first Muslim Principal to be named National Distinguished Principal by the National Association of Elementary School Principals (NAESP).



Omar Qureshi (MEd, PhD)

Dr. Omar Qureshi is the Director of Integrated Curriculum at Yaqeen Institute for Islamic Research, in Irving, Texas. He previously taught Western and Islamic Philosophy and was the head of the Diploma in Contextual Islamic Studies & Leadership (CISLD) at Cambridge Muslim College, in the UK, and served as Provost and Assistant Professor of Liberal and Islamic Studies at Zaytuna College, Berkeley, California. Dr. Qureshi earned his Bachelor of Arts in Microbiology and subsequently his MEd in Curriculum and Instruction – Science Education, both from the University of Missouri, Columbia. Later, he earned his PhD in Cultural and Educational Policy Studies with a specialization in the Philosophy of Education from Loyola University Chicago in 2016. His dissertation, titled “Badr al-Dīn Ibn Jamā’ah and the Highest Good of Islamic Education,” explores the topic of educational institutional identity in the United States. Dr. Qureshi’s prior teaching experiences include serving as principal and dean of academics at a parochial school located in the western suburbs of Chicago.

Dr. Raudah Yunus is a researcher, writer and public health specialist. Dr. Yunus spent her medical school years in Alexandria, Egypt, where she also learnt Arabic language and literature.
